

The second **Hay Festival Querétaro** exceeded all expectations and brought together **27,000 people** over four days. This important gathering included more than **141 guests**, with writers, journalists, activists, philosophers, scientists and musicians from all over the world, making Querétaro the literary capital of Mexico.

Literature and ideas loomed large through the voices of figures such as British author and screenwriter **Hanif Kureishi**; the Italian writer **Paolo Giordano**; the Brazilian novelist, winner of the 2005 Prince of Asturias Prize for Literature, **Nélida Piñón**; the cult Argentinean writer, **César Aira**; the US writer and journalist **Lionel Shriver**; and the Mexican author **Guillermo Arriaga**.

There was a focus on human rights activism, with the presence of the Russian conceptual artist **Nadya Tolokno**, a member of the band Pussy Riot, who was accompanied by the British journalist **Misha Glenny** in one of the most exacting and compelling events of the day.

The Nobel Laureate **Jody Williams**, who was awarded the keys of the city by the municipal president, Marcos Aguilar Vega.

In conversation about journalism were Lydia Cacho (Mexico), Jon Lee Anderson (US) and Mark Thompson (UK) who discussed the challenges facing journalists in an era when fake news is on the rise.

Physicist Christophe Galfard (France) talked to the Chilean astronomer María Teresa Ruiz about the existence of hundreds of recently discovered planets, and about man's unique ability to understand the stars.

The guest list included some of the region's most promising young writers, who had featured in the Bogotá 39 2017 selection; **38 writers and thinkers from Querétaro** were also involved.

Music, too, had its place with the Colombian band **Systema Solar**, the Cuban singer-songwriter **Haydée Milanés** and the British pianist **James Rhodes**.

Hay Festivalito, the children's festival, included activities with Mexican writers Tamar Cohen, Raquel Castro, Adriana Grimaldo, José Luis Trueba and Francisco Haghenbeck, together with the illustrator Juan Gedovius.

Hay Joven, a programme of events for young adults, was held at the city's universities, and the 7th Publishing Talent Conference demonstrated the festival's commitment to the publishing industry, with a number of Ibero-American publishers taking part.

After the end of the eighth **Hay Festival** in Mexico, Querétaro has established itself as the ideal venue for this celebration of culture, and is now here to stay in El Bajío, promoting literature, art, culture and inclusive of the diverse audiences that form a part of the **Hay Festival Querétaro**.










ABOUT HAY FESTIVAL

Hay Festival brings readers and writers together to share stories and ideas in sustainable events around the world. The festivals inspire, examine and entertain, inviting participants to imagine the world as it is and as it might be.

Hay Festival is an international celebration of arts and sciences that has been held for the past 30 years in Hay-on-Wye, a small town in Wales that is famous for its bookshops. The Festival lasts 11 days, hosts more than 700 events, debates, interviews and concerts. Its audience comes from the UK, Europe and the Americas.

Hay Festival has expanded to run Festivals around the world since 2006 including Hay Festival Cartagena de Indias (Colombia), Hay Festival Segovia (Spain) Hay Festival Queretaro (Mexico) and Hay Festival Arequipa (Peru). Hay curates '39' gatherings of emerging writers which has been run in Bogota (2007), Beirut (2010), Port Harcourt (Nigeria 2014), Mexico (2015), Aarhus, Denmark (2017) and Bogota 39 (2018) which selects and promotes 39 writers under 40.

The Hay Festival is committed to:

- Sharing literature locally and internationally in order to promote dialogue, cultural exchange, education and development.
- Presenting inclusive and accessible events with international artists, and contributing to social action and development;
- Providing free tickets to students in tertiary education, and to pupils on Schools Days at each festival.
- Working with local and international institutions, organisations and private companies, maximizing the impact of the festivals' connection with the local population.
- Increasing the impact of Hay Festival events through Hay Player reaching a global audience in English and Spanish languages.
